FUNERAL:

The funeral of **Mrs Evelyn Patton** (née Carson), a former member of CCR, and mother of John and Diana, took place in CCR on Monday 25th January. Her forceful integrity and charitable activities were remembered by Revd Katherine Meyer, the officiant.

CONGREGATIONAL COMMITTEE:

The meeting on 12th January was dominated by property related matters. Elsewhere it was noted that vacancies still existed for a chief housekeeper and a convenor for what was renamed the Fellowship and Fundraising committee. FWO contributions in 2015 were about 5% less than in 2014. The Hon Treasurer was endeavouring to retrieve a high level of tax returns from the Revenue Commissioners. Committee elections would take place in March. On property matters the Committee noted with pleasure that the work to remedy the dry rot was almost completed. Work was continuing to restore proper ventilation of the upper walls. It was decided to paint the new wainscoting in as close a match as possible to the existing colour. Some woodworm had been discovered in the area near the dry rot, and was to be treated. The property committee was attempting to repair defects early by making annual investigations of sources of potential problems - for example the condition of the stained glass, and of areas prone to damp or woodworm damage. Damage caused by storm Desmond had revealed problems with pointing and damp, and a full inspection of the roof would be needed in the near future. Estimates for a new acoustic system were being obtained, and it was hoped work would proceed later in the spring. It was agreed to refit the coffee dock beside the Committee room. Work was needed on the vestry toilet. It was noted that the buildings were not always left with lights and taps properly turned off at night.

ECUMENICAL ACTIVITIES

Lenten Meditation: Last year's successful programme of silent meditation will be repeated from **10th February** to **23rd March** from 7.45 to 8.30 am Monday to Friday at the Church of the Three Patrons, Rathgar Road.

World Day of Prayer: This worldwide, ecumenical, lay-led service will be revived in our area on **Friday 4th March** at 5 pm, also in the hospitable Church of the Three Patrons. This year's service on the theme "Receive Children - Receive Me!" has been prepared by the churches of Cuba. The involvement of older primary school students will be encouraged.
